Movie Group

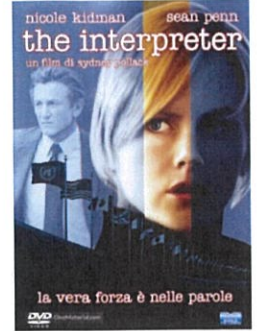
Our film for Tuesday 20th October is **The Interpreter**.

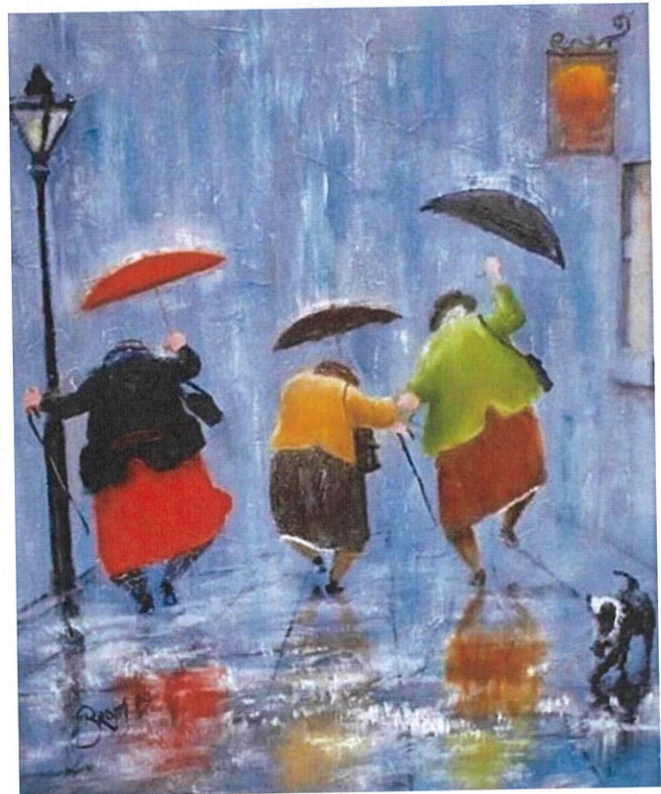

Glossary

Espresso Martini Cream :

Fresh whipped cream flavoured with coffee and Kahlua.

Jambalaya:

A wildly popular dish originating in West Africa, with rice, vegetables, stock, mussels, ham hock meat and sausage.

Choy Sum:

An Asian green, mild in flavour , similar to Bok Choy

Fondant potatoes:

Slow cooked in stock

Pork chops San Francisco style:

Seared and slow baked until tender in a gravy with soy sauce, garlic, and brown sugar.

Stuffed beef sirloin rolls:

Rolled and stuffed sirloin with garlic, onions, mushrooms, cheese, spinach, then sliced, seared, and baked in red wine jus until tender. Served with Potato Voisin – sliced potato slow baked with butter.
