Village Manager's Corner

It will be a busy start to next week beginning 2 November with the AGM on Monday afternoon at 2pm and then the Melbourne Cup followed by the Birthday Dinner on the Tuesday.

Telephone Outage in the Lodge – on Friday 30 October from 1100 – 1200 the Avaya phone system in the Lodge will be upgraded. This means there will be no landline service for apartment residents, Care, the Kitchen and Reception for that hour.

- If you need the Kitchen during that hour call 027 293 2458

This upgrade does not affect our emergency call system.

Gardening – the 2 big projects which were the rear garden and walkway area behind the Lodge and the Care area gardens, will have been completed by Friday 30 October.

The plan for the week commencing 2 November is after the rubbish round the team will spend the week trimming and pruning all resident and communal frontages.

The week of 9 November the team will start in the villa gardens spraying, weeding, mulching, trimming and checking sprinkler heads. They will commence with Beech street and work their way around the village. A weekly update on the progress will be published in the newsletter.

Covid-19 Update -

As advised by the Government, we continue to do 3 things in Level 1:

Games Room – the cove lighting has been replaced so it is now bright and evenly coloured around the ceiling edge – makes such a difference.

Fairview Ave Street Sign – our new street sign has an error. They have called our street Fairview Dr instead of Fairview Ave. I have logged another job with Auckland Council.

New kerb ramp – a ramp has been measured and ordered for the walkway kerb between Villas 126 and 128 to improve access.

Roadworks - Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency advises that overnight maintenance works are scheduled to take place on State Highway 1 (SH1) between Oteha Valley Road and Silverdale commencing Sunday 1 November for approximately two weeks. Both northbound and southbound lanes between Oteha Valley Road and Silverdale will be closed between 9 pm and 5 am on:

- Sunday 1 November to Thursday 5 November
- Sunday 8 November to Tuesday 10 November
- Contingency dates are Wednesday 11 and Thursday 12 November

The BP Service Station Dairy Flat and other shops will be closed. A signposted detour along Dairy Flat Highway for both northbound and southbound traffic will be in place. This closure is required to carry out a range of maintenance tasks, including drainage upgrade work at the Lonely Track Road overbridge.

Hi everyone

Just a reminder this week about the type of things we can do for you here at the clinic.

ACC dressings. Very important to get those skin tears tended to quickly if you are at all immune compromised, have circulatory problems, skin problems, joint pain etc. No charge for this service.

All other dressings eg after surgeries, skin cancers etc. Sometimes if we are using special dressings there will be a small cost involved.

Injections – whether they are Vit B12 or other – happy to give those.

Removal of Sutures

Recordings that you or your doctor may want – and just a general wellness check from us overall at any time

Assisting with working your way around the Health System or deciphering those discharge letters or lab results.

Transferring doctors

Putting in referrals for continence products, care assistance in the home etc.

Supplying some basic aids such as grab handles, shower stools etc.

Making sure aids delivered are at the right height for you, stable etc.

Just lending an ear and listening to any concerns you do have.

Administration of medication or putting on of TED stockings.

And anything else related to your care that you require we are happy to help.

The one thing we are asked about is can we issue a recert for a drivers licence. Unfortunately no, the only nurses that can do that have to be attached to a doctors surgery and we are employed by Fairview itself so sorry we can't help you with that one. Whew...

Glossary

Twice-fried pork:

Crumbed pork fillet schnitzels, served with a delicious gravy including HP sauce, herbs, tomato sauce and Worcestershire sauce.

Chicken Piccata:

Free range chicken boneless thighs, sauteed in butter, served in a white wine, caper and lemon juice sauce.

Venison Ragout:

Diced venison casserole, with red wine, cream, herbs, vegetables and stock, served topped with a cooked mushroom creamy mascarpone sauce.

Potato Noodles:

A German potato dish, of mashed potato cooked with milk, egg and semolina flour. Cooled and cut into diamond shapes, and panfried in butter.

Potato dauphinoise:

A baked French potato dish, with sliced potato with eggs, milk, cream, garlic and topped with cheese.

Champ:

An Irish comfort food, mashed potato with spring onion, milk, butter

Provançal tomatoes:

A French baked tomato dish, topped with parsley, dried herbs, garlic, anchovies and breadcrumbs
