Safety & Security: Jackie - Advised 1 high light on corner of Dahlia is not working correctly.

Bar Sub-Committee. – Tom advised that no meeting had taken place during the month. The bar is now open and training is currently taking place for the Eftpos operation. It was suggested that a note is placed in the newsletter to advise the current bar weekly operating times.

It was agreed that funding for the purchase of bar mats be approved around \$300.00 cost.

New Residents: Tricia advised that new residents had been visited.

Events Group: Discussions had taken place re the running of the Birthday/Melbourne Cup event on the 3rd Nov.

Alastair Glyn-Jones will arrange for the Melbourne Cup Sweepstake with tickets to be on sale on the Cup Day between 10am-1pm in the Card Room.

Glossary

Thai chicken curry :

Free range chicken in a mild red curry sauce with kaffir lime leaves, coconut cream, coriander and lemongrass.

Pilaf rice:

Onion cooked in vegetable stock with onion, capicum, thyme.

Chicken & mushroom

strudel:

Free range chicken and a variety of mushrooms in a creamy, marsala (sherry) sauce with parsley, cheese and onions, wrapped in filo pastry layered with finely ground roasted hazelnuts.

Celariac:

The root of a type of celery, it has a delicious nutty, celery-like flavour.
