



SUMMARY OF DECISIONS MADE AT RESIDENTS COMMITTEE MARCH MEETING

To assist residents to be informed of decisions made by the Residents Committee below is a summary of matters following our meeting of the 16th March 2021. Full Minutes will be available in the library following the confirmation of the minutes at the next monthly meeting.

Financial position as at 28th February 2021

Current Account \$4103.73

Grants Approved. Nil

Reports:

Bar Sub-Committee. – Tom advised that the Bar AGM had been held and committee positions had all been re-elected. A Motion changing some items in the Bar Constitution had been agreed and this motion would be presented to the Residents AGM to change their Constitution.

New Residents: Tricia advised that 2 new residents Brian & Pam Glaum had entered the village during the month.

Events Group: A Themed Irish night has been arranged by Marion for the 17th March. The group has also been working on plans for the running of the Anzac Day dinner on the 25th April. Bugler and Ode reader in place.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1. Gardens: Management advised that planning is proceeding on staffing and plans to bring the gardens back to an acceptable standard.
2. Letter from I Devonshire re the RVRANZ document was discussed. The committee confirmed their decision from their March meeting that this was an individual decision by all residents to make. A reply was to be sent to Ian covering the points he raised.
3. Tai Chi. It was agreed that the subsidised funding would continue for a further 6 months. Gareth to be advised that he should work with the Nurse and apply to Management to have management pay for the subsidy as is the case with Strength & Balance as this class does add considerably to the wellbeing of those participating.
4. Blokes Shed. A funding application received from David Browne re the purchase of a new machine was discussed. The committee was of the opinion that as this was a capital item David should approach management for this purchase. The committee has been in agreement for repair items to be funded as in the past but this purchase was considered out of this category. It was also noted that as no funds have been allocated from the Bar Committee over recent months with the non-opening of the bar due to Covid-19 this has affected the committees thinking.
5. Babbage have been working in the village recently endeavoring to complete the signing off on Certification on Villas. This is a work in progress still.
6. Work is still progressing on adding safety trellis around those Villas that have a safety concern alongside their driveways where there is a concerning drop below.
7. Two requests to Management were lodged by the Committee:
A Seeking the dropping of Weekly Fees once accommodation was relinquished.
B Asking Management to look at refurbishment of Villas and apartments where the long-term residents had been in residence for 15 years and over.
8. Management advised that these requests would be forwarded to the Board but there was little chance of these requests being granted.

It was agreed that the AGM of the Residents Association will be held on Thursday 6th May 2021 at 10.30am
