Influenza Immunisation

The consent forms are at the front desk for you to fill in and return.

I need all consents back by next Tuesday the 13th, no exceptions. After this date you will have to receive your immunisations from your own Doctor.

Please note that the flu injections will not be available to anyone under 65 until late May. If you have any queries from family and friends as to why they are unable to get immunised, it is all hands on deck for 65 and over first. This is so there is time in between (at least 2 weeks) for the Covid injections. Dr Hunter will be here at 2pm on Thursday the 15th of April, Sharon his nurse will come with him to administer the injections.

Northcross Pharmacy will be here at 9am Friday the 16th April.

Both clinics will be held in the doctor's rooms.

We of course do ask that after your injection you stay around the lodge, either in the library, games room or dining room just in case there are any adverse reactions.

Hello everyone, this month we are going to visit the Greenlaw Gardens in Helensville. This will be about an hour's drive through our lovely countryside to arrive at the gardens in time for a leisurely walk around before a yummy homemade lunch. Immediately around the house is suitable for walkers and there are plenty of seats plus the veranda to sit on.

Heat Pump Service

I am told by the experts that heat pumps require servicing on an annual basis but if your unit is not often used then every 2 years would suffice. The information below is from Neil Duff, Heat Pump Cleaning specialist www.heatpumpclean.co.nz.

We usually charge \$145 per heat pump service but because I already have more than 10 in the village that I service we can do them for \$100 inc gst.

The service involves:

Indoor Unit

- · Check the operating temperature and airflow efficiency before and after service.
- Remove filters and spray with a degreaser that kills any bacteria or fungi growing on them. Then scrub them clean.
- Spray a degreaser on the coils and fan motor. We then use a special steam machine to get in to the tight spots and get rid of fungi or bacterial growing inside. We catch all the dirt in a bag underneath.
- · Remove any fine dust in and around the unit.
- · Change remote batteries if they need changing.

Outdoor Unit

- · Apply cleaning solution to fins and coil.
- · Clear foliage from around outside unit.
- · Clean intake screens.
- Clean and check fan blades.
- Test and check noise levels.
- · Check for any vermin, if any, spray with bug killer.

GLOSSARY:

<u>Grilled fresh sardines</u> – whole sardines pan-fried with olive oil, lemon, salt, New York black pepper, and lots of parsley.

<u>Kingfish roasted in butter</u> – a firm flaked, rich and sweet, slightly meaty fish, rubbed both sides with butter, paprika, lemon juice, lemon zest, and parsley and chives.

<u>Chicken & mushroom pithivier</u> – a round, enclosed dome-shaped puff pastry pie, with a scalloped edge and scored spiral design on top.

<u>Canadian seafood chowder</u>— a hearty soup with a creamy base, and a mix of vegetables like potato, carrot, onion and celery, loaded with seafood — mussels, prawns, white fish, with dill and lemon zest.

<u>Ratatouille</u> – French vegetable stew in a tomato base with eggplant, courgetti, onion, garlic and red capsicum
