In regard to the opening of the Australia/New Zealand Travel bubble, we wanted to put in writing how we see this impacting the village. Specifically, in relation to visitors of the village and residents travelling:

We appreciate that this step forward is a positive one, however we do want to maintain caution and awareness around anything that could have a negative effect on the village. Both the New Zealand Government and the Australian Government have deemed it safe to travel between the countries without the need to isolate, and therefore we will allow visitors from Australia who have travelled under this new 'bubble' to visit/stay in the village.

We do want to stress though, that all visitors who are going to stay are recorded at reception, as is now current practice, and we are very focused on making sure we have noted the origin of the visitor and the flight number of the plane.

This will be particularly important if we do experience any community outbreaks. We also want to remind residents that if you are going to be away from the village (overnight etc.) then please do let us know at reception. This will also be recorded so that if there is an event at the village we know that you are not here so we will not be looking for you.

Again, in light of the potential travel to Australia we will keep the details of where you are going and for how long so if there is a community outbreak we have the details on file. If you do decide to travel please make sure that you have a plan for if the borders suddenly close on either side, this may require additional funds or a place to stay.

Finally, as per usual, if you or your visitors show any signs of COVID-19 or are feeling unwell then please stay away from the community areas, get a COVID test and self-isolate until the test is returned.



#### **Northern Corridor Improvements**



#### Plan ahead: New SH18 eastbound off-ramp opens 27 April

North Shore drivers are advised to get ready for a big change to how they travel on SH18 when a new eastbound off-ramp at Paul Matthews Road opens after Anzac weekend. The new road layout will shift all traffic heading east through a new intersection at Paul Matthews Road. The biggest change is that drivers must turn right at new traffic lights on the off-ramp, to head to Unsworth Heights, the SH1 motorway at Constellation Drive or to continue travel to East Coast Bays.

People are advised to plan ahead as major delays are expected during peak times. This is a significant change and road users will need to be patient while everyone adjusts. Motorists are encouraged to avoid SH18 altogether and use alternative routes. For people travelling from the west to the city, they can use the Northwestern Motorway (SH16) instead.

The layout will remain in place as work on the project continues.

#### Light poles installed on the Albany Busway Bridge

The urban design for the project looks to the ancestral use of the wider area for safe passage and harvesting kai (food), whether by ara (tracks) or awa (water). Design elements of the bridges, bridge barriers and retaining wall panels provide travellers with a connection to the cultural and ancestral landscape of the area.

For people travelling from the North, the new Albany Busway Bridge is the first distinctive landmark of the project and references the movement of a waka (canoe) through water. The light poles which are currently being installed are positioned in a way so as to be reminiscent of hoe (paddle) stroking through water from a waka. We plan to turn on the lights at night later in the year.

#### CHOCOLATE CAKE (with an extra layer)

In order to impress the 'new boyfriend,' I invited him home to meet my parents.

Of course, knowing his favourite was chocolate cake, I set about to make the most scrumptious one ever.

Unfortunately, as we each took our first bite of the beautifully iced cake, we struggled to munch our way through the two layers. It didn't take too long, before we realised the novice cook's error.

No one had told me that, after removing the cake from the two tins, the greaseproof paper (used to prevent the cake from sticking to the tin) should also be removed!

A good laugh, at the time, but can't remember if anyone came back for a second helping.

#### MOIST CHOCOLATE CAKE (original recipe)

#### (Preferably, to be made in a non-stick tin, if you have one)

4 ozs butter 1 cup sugar 2T golden syrup 1 egg

1 cup milk 2 cups flour 1 tspn Baking Powder

2 T cocoa 1 tspn cinnamon ¼ tspn salt

Vanilla essence 1 tspn baking soda ½ cup milk

Grease & paper 8inch (square tin) — remembering to remove the paper after cooking!!!!

#### Method

Cream butter & sugar with golden syrup.

Add egg & beat well.

Stir in first mixture of milk.

Fold dry ingredients into creamed mixture. Add vanilla.

Dissolve soda in second mixture of milk & add to batter.

Mix well & place in prepared tin.

Bake 45 mins at 180 degrees C.



**Safety & Security:** Jackie – Tabled a full report covering lights and areas of concern that need attention for the Management.

Bar Sub-Committee. - Tom advised the following.

Diane Brown has resigned and was thanked for her services.

Financial Report showed good results over the last 3 months.

Sunday trading has been discontinued. The bar will however be open for groups of more than 10 people or Family events.

**Events Group:** Plans for the running of the Anzac Day dinner on the 25<sup>th</sup> April are all in place. A good attendance is booked.

Advice was given that Len Hancy wishes to arrange a Singers show on a suitable date to work in with a dinner.

Angela Woolnough was also keen to arrange for a pantomime to be produced for July and worked as entertainment with a dinner.

Management have agreed to fund entertainment for the Village Birthday function in June.

#### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

- 1. The Motion for change in the Constitution from the Bar Committee was discussed. It was agreed that the changes proposed did not require approval from the AGM as they are primarily operating procedures within the bar and have no overall effect that relates to the current Constitution.
- 2. Management have been asked to check all smoke alarms in Villas and Apartments to ensure they are operating properly.
- 3. Committee Nominations. The list of Nominees for Chairman and 7 Committee members is on the Notice Board in the reception area. There is currently 1 nomination for Chairman and 7 nominations for the Committee. Shirley Yates has today advised she is not standing for a further term.
- 4. Gardens: Management advised that additional staffing has been employed. They are working through the many requests that they have on file to meet resident's needs.
- 5. Terry advised that an update on Certification on Villas will be issued to residents shortly. This is a work in progress still.
- 6. Work is still progressing on adding safety trellis around those Villas that have a safety concern alongside their driveways where there is a concerning drop below.
- 7. The Committee discussed the format for the introduction for new residents with Terry and Adrian. The Management have agreed to establish a formular to ensure new people are introduced to the village residents on a programmed basis at our Friday Happy Hour drinks once every 2 months.
- 8. Seating in the Lounge was discussed. Management will endeavor to plan the seating layouts to meet the demands of the residents.

#### Glossary
