I would appreciate knowing if you have had the vaccine so I can have some sort of record of who has and who hasn't so please let me know. A phone call on 021 861706 or an email.

Again don't panic if you haven't been called up. There is a possibility now that your own doctor will be able to give the injections from July – not that far away and a safe option.

Medical and Next of Kin information

I have mentioned before that I would like this information behind your door so that we can find it in an emergency. However, what I failed to point out to the new residents is which door. The pantry door is where I would like it kept. I do have forms here that I can give to you. On the form it asks what medication you are on. We all know how often your medication gets tweaked especially for blood pressure medication so rather than listing it again if you could just write where we can find it. This way we have the prescribed dose on the bottles. Remember to never decant your pills out of the prescribed bottle from the chemist unless it is in a blister pack – this is dangerous especially if you are unwell. Mistakes can easily be made.

Pendants

If you have a pendant please try to remember not to leave the village with it on. It cuts out and alerts me on my computer and I have to re set it. Today I had 6 to re set.

Advance Care Plans

I have a few copies here at the office of an Advance Care Plan. This is quite detailed and expresses your wishes. It is easy for your spouse and family to follow. You can download one yourself or just go to Advance Care Planning our voice and it should show you the link. This will specify at different levels of illness what medical care you would wish to receive.

Resuscitation Plan

The above leads me to this.

As you know the nurses now have their own defibrillator and although we haven't had to use it in the time I've been here I have had 2 situations where I have had to make very quick decisions as to its use or not. It would help greatly if you discussed this with your loved ones and let us know if you would wish to have a DNR or Do Not Resuscitate on your file. It's easy for me to talk about this as it's a fact of our job and I understand that it may be more difficult for you and bring to mind relatives that have passed etc so if you need to discuss it please feel free to come in any time.

Number 4 daughter and the Irish Man have a home!!! And you know what I have said before ... If number 4 is happy we are all happy. In fact, in a strange twist, it is next door to number 2 daughter. They get along very well so I don't have concerns with things being thrown across the fence line. The Irishman had a difficult time explaining it to his parents who always thought he would eventually return home to run the country pub they own but he said they were happy that he was here and safe and this is what happens these days.

I know I am very lucky to have the 4 girls in the same city – it wasn't always that way, but the draw of NZ was too much – thank you New Zealand.

Bread Pudding

250g bread end pieces (8 crusts) broken into small pieces

60g dark brown sugar

60g margarine

1 egg beaten

2 tsp mixed spice

1.5 cups milk

Soak bread in milk until smooth. Melt marg and combine with remaining ingredients. Turn into a well greased loaf tin. Bake at 160C for 1-1 ¼ hours until firm.

We have been notified by our supplier that meat, with lamb in particular, is set to increase in price between 20-30% by the end of the year. Our initial increase is \$1 per kg. We will absorb this initial increase, however we will look at pricing again in the next few months.

Our supplier advises that China is aggressively buying NZ meat, especially lamb and beef, which has resulted in reduced stock available to purchase in NZ, which drives the price up.


Movie Group -


