The story is that in 1904, Davis and his wife Ciddy ran a sandwich stand at the St. Louis World's Fair. Historian Frank X. Tolbert noted that Athens resident Clint Murchison said his grandfather dated the hamburger to the 1880s with "Old Dave" a.k.a. Fletcher Davis. A photo of "Old Dave's Hamburger Stand" from 1904 was sent to Tolbert as evidence of the claim.

Boiled Fruit Cake

5 oz butter

34 cup sugar

1 1/2 cups sultanas or mixed fruit

1 1/2 cups water

Place all together in a saucepan and bring slowly to the boil stirring well.

Boil for 5 minutes. Leave in saucepan to cool.

Sift 2 level cups of flour, 1 level tsp baking powder, 1 level tsp bicarbonate of soda and fold into the cooled liquid. Bake at 180 degrees Celsius for about 45 minutes in a greased and lined 8 inch square tin. Leave to cool before removing from tin.

This recipe was given to me by my grandmother-in-law nearly 60 years ago when I was a newlywed and was keen to impress with my baking skills. A friend asked me one evening for the recipe which I gave to her from memory because I had made it so often. She phoned about half and hour later wanting to know if there should be any water in the ingredients! I obviously had not told her (maybe she had not written it down) and her saucepan had what looked like toffee in it. Woops! Yes, we are still friends.

Movie Group -



My Covid Vaccination Experience

Hello everyone

I thought it might be of interest for me to tell you all of my experience of the COVID vaccination process.

I have to go overseas soon (my mother's 100th) and so I wanted to be getting my vaccination as soon as possible. I looked on the COVID 19 vaccination website and determined I was in group 3 for vaccinations which was due to start in "late May". I looked further on the website and found an 0800 number which said that it could be used for information and changing appointments. The number is 0800 282 926. I thought I would give it a go even though it did not say it was specifically for making appointments. I was kept on hold for about 15 minutes but in the meantime there was someone answering frequently asked questions. This was useful since I was taking antibiotics and steroids and I was reassured that this was no barrier to getting the vaccination.

The person who answered the phone was extremely helpful. I explained that I wanted an appointment (which she called a "manual" appointment). She said that these appointments were filling up fast but I said I didn't mind travelling and I got an appointment for the next week in Henderson. I received a reminder text the weekend before my appointment.

The traffic to Henderson was a mission. Fortunately, Alastair drove me and we made it! Parking was cordoned off with parking attendants so it was easy. I had been told to bring a mask and a means of identification. I was ushered in, had my temperature taken, filled out the consent form (you will need your NHI number) and was queried about any COVID symptoms. The other questions were about any other vaccinations (it had been 6 weeks since my flu jab) and any cancer treatment. I was then sent to the nurse who asked all the questions again and also detailed possible side effects (sore arm, flu-like symptoms). I signed the consent form in front of her. The prick in the arm was not as bad as the flu jab.

I was given a little card filled in with the vaccine details. They recommended taking a photo of it in case of loss. I was told that I would receive a text with my next appointment details within 3-4 weeks. Then there was a 20 minute wait to ensure that there were no immediate ill effects and I was on my way to a cup of coffee.
