There is also a facility opening or possibly already opened in Albany. If you ring the number below you may be able to book in there instead of Birkenhead, however if you have already booked best not to change the booking or you will be waiting longer.

Again, Dr Hunter will be able to do the mop up and give vaccinations here but when and how many vaccines he will be given is still an unknown.

Remember that there is the risk of feeling unwell for a day or two. This is okay, but if you have serious side effects let us know.


Our film for Tuesday 22 June is **Nureyev**.



General

- Alastair tabled two complaints he had received from a village resident. After some discussion about the role the residents committee might play, Alastair undertook to discuss the matter with Adrian outside the meeting.
- There was a request that the photo board of committee members that is displayed in the library be updated. Alastair agreed to do this.
- There was a general discussion about funding for the social committee activities. There was support for a proposal to use a mix of residents committee funds and funds to be requested from village management for this. Amounts of \$2,000 from both these sources (total of \$4,000) per year were suggested. Alastair agreed to investigate the viability of this and report back.
- A proposal was made that the subsidy for the Tai Chi classes be withdrawn. This was not supported by a majority of the committee.
- A list of volunteer drivers for travel to medical appointments was tabled with a proposal that it be refreshed and made more widely known. Alastair undertook to have it published in the newsletter.
- Adrian updated the progress of the concept of a 'basic garden' for villas and said that a first sample has been done. He and Alastair would continue to discuss the draft proposal for gardens in the village.
