An interesting note on Petanque - I really would invite you to give it a go: The game of Petanque was devised in 1910, in a charming little town between Marseille and Toulon called La Ciotat. In those days, the locals played the so-called *jeu provençal*, which is now much less popular than Petanque. The rules of the *jeu provençal* stipulate that, before throwing the boule, a player must gain momentum by taking one or two running steps.

It happened one day that one of the game's great figures, a certain Jules LeNoir, was confined to a wheelchair as a result of an accident. He was mortified, believing that this would deprive him of the pleasure of the game forever. The other villagers, however, were so concerned for their friend that they voted to change the rules of the game so that he would not be disadvantaged. The new rules eliminated the running requirement; in Petanque, players must throw the boule from within a circle scratched in the dirt, without running steps. In the dialect of the region, it was said that one had to play "*pieds tanqués*" (feet stuck, pé tanca in Provencal), and so was born a new variant of the game.

While I know this might not be an interest of most, I for one, will be giving this a go. This is a lovely part of the village that we can get involved in, with different recreational activities and build relationships.

Winter has stepped up with a week of cold evenings and wet days.

Stay warm and dry. Enjoy the weekend with your family and some doughnuts from our lovely café!!!

Nurses Corner

Hi All,

COVID-19 Vaccination Plan

Please do not shoot the messenger.

I realise for some of you this is a stressful time. Most of you have not yet been notified around a booking for Covid. I can tell you that I was talking to a Doctor in Accident and Emergency last Sunday who had only just had her first vaccine, so you are not alone - even some of the doctors on the Front Line are only just getting their vaccine.

Management at Fairview have been onto the DHB to ask them to come and vaccinate in the village, but at this point of time we have not had a positive response. I would presume that this is because they do not have the vaccinators to do this, this is the only logical explanation for this.

If you are wondering why, I and my nurses cannot give the vaccines it is more complicated than just drawing up and giving an injection. There are lots of hurdles and some we can just not get through.

New Zealand is safe, yes, we could have an outbreak at any time, but we have resources, and we are geographically safer than other countries and again we would go into lock down. That is our worst-case scenario.

You will get vaccinated. It is a matter of time. Ring the number below. When you go you can take a support person who can get vaccinated at the same time. You may have to go further than Birkenhead to get your vaccine so it would be wise to take your support person.

Dr Hunter will be able to come in and give vaccinations however this will not be done until group 4 and whereas that was July it would now be August September.

The vaccination helpline is 0800 282 926.

Hospital Admissions

I have just again been through the experience of taking mum into North Shore Hospital for admission, she is fine and home, but I thought I would just share a little of what went on so that it can give you some insight into your rights.

The admission process was very smooth. In and seeing the doctor, X rays etc in 4 hours. Then a nurse swoops in and says now Dorothy give me your arm and starts to administer something. I said hold on what are you putting into my mothers' veins. What they were giving her was a covering antibiotic – no reason for this, did not ask if she had any allergies (she does). There was a series of other things that happened. My mother has no dementia, she is a bright woman but from the old school of the doctors and nurses are always right.

It made me think about a few of you that go into hospital without that support with you. Know you can always ring us for advice. Sometimes you just may need to have that person that you can talk to, and we are happy to listen and advise the best we can. So put this number in your phone or into your address book 021 861 706.


Our film for Tuesday 15 June is **the Dig**.


